The office staff and Board have been extremely busy since camp has ended. We are diligently preparing for the 2025 Camping Season and considering opening the camp to other groups who want to camp, aside from Special Needs Campers.

We have hired 3 Directors to work together in our office as a team. The Director of Operations (all things maintenance and certifications) is Joe Hicks, the Director of Programs (oversees all campers, nurses & runs the camping season) is Kelly McMullen and the Director of Marketing/Fundraising (handles fundraising and grant writing) is Alison Burian. These 3 employees are instrumental in the success of Beacon Lodge. They are doing an excellent job!

Special thanks to all of the clubs who supported the BL Golf Outing by purchasing a \$100 hole sign. Our District purchased 19 signs and contributed to the \$42,000 that was raised with our biggest fundraiser of the year. Just to make you aware, our proposed operating budget for the year is \$900,000.

November is the time of year to support the Beacon Lodge 500 Club - a \$5 donation for every Lion member of every club. Many clubs have budgeted for this but for those who have not, your Lion's Camp depends on you to make your donation. The 500 club helps with maintenance at the camp - and with over 500 acres there is a LOT of maintenance. Just electricity, heating and air conditioning account for a huge part of the budget. Please see the support letter that accompanies this packet. Last year we had donations of \$2,140 from 11 Lions Clubs and 1 Leo Club in District 14-K. This years goal is \$2,600. If every club donated we would reach \$3,600. That would be sensational.

Katlin has been with Pa Lions Camp in February of 2020 as the Office Manager. She is very hard working and dedicated to the Camp. She


