- -Mental Health First Aid Training in partnership with hospitals or NAMI chapters
- 3. Youth Development
- -Community-Based Leo Clubs at schools or youth centers
- -College and Career Readiness Workshops with school districts
- -Youth Leadership Conferences in collaboration with educational foundations
- 4. Environmental Initiatives
- -E-Waste Recycling Drives at libraries or schools
- -Community Clean-Up Days with parks and recreation departments
- -Tree Planting Projects with local environmental groups
