Enjoyed the entertainment provided by the camp attendees. Even DG Scott Lohman was in the gallery enjoying the entertainment. Can you spot him?

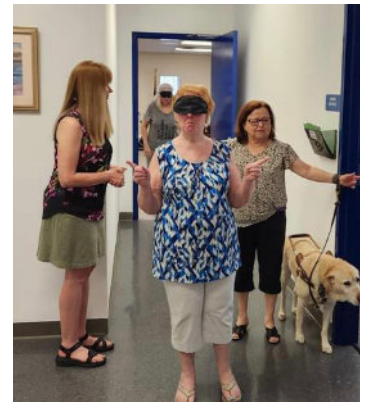

LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES

You've seen them throughout your neighborhoods, parks, school fronts and playgrounds. Many are unique in shape, size and design. You may have walked or driven by them, maybe even stopped to check them out. What I'm referring to are Little Free Libraries. They are tiny boxes, usually attached to a post that store maybe 15-20 books for anyone to peruse through. The basic concept is "take a book, leave a book." Most of the little libraries are registered with the Little Free Library app which allows you to find a little library anywhere in the United States. Other little libraries are placed by individuals that choose not to register their library. But the same concept applies.

Many of the little libraries are in need of books for their inventory. Recently, members of the **Greater Lehigh Valley Community Lions Club** took part in a Little Free Library BINGO Challenge. Members collected hundreds of used books and brought them to their June meeting to place stickers inside them providing information about the club. They then took their books and Little Free Library BINGO cards along to participate in the challenge. Each time a challenge task was completed, they checked it off on their BINGO card. Some challenges included: share a book in a Little Free Library, make a bookmark to leave in the library, take a selfie at a library and read aloud to someone (even your dog!). The BINGO cards were provided by LittleFreeLibrary.org.

The first three finishers were required to send selfies from a little library to win their prizes. The top finishers were Lions Darlene Bauer, Sharon Friedman and Emily Perruso. All of the participants had fun searching for libraries and donating books as they accepted the challenge to be the first to post BINGO. So if you happen to have used books and are wondering what to do with them, stop by a Little Free Library and place some in the box. Or, feel free to take a book and leave a book. Donated books can be for any age group.



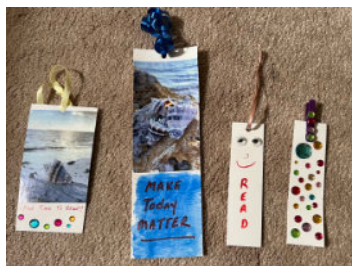

DISTRICT 14K WELCOMES NEW LIONS CLUB

The Greater Lehigh Valley Community Lions Club

I'd like to introduce everyone to the Lions District 14-K's newest club named The Greater Lehigh Valley Community Lions Club (GLVCLC). We can be found in Region I Zone A, mostly representing the city of Allentown. Since our first meeting in March, we have grown our membership to 16 with an average age of 59 years old. Members are from a diverse area throughout the Lehigh Valley, from Orefield to Plainfield Township. In addition our club is currently trending toward increased membership numbers.

It's been quite a learning curve since only two members have prior experience with Lions or Lioness clubs. Those of you who are charter members of your clubs, surely recall the painstaking task of getting things up and running with few resources to start with. That's also been true for us as we start our new club. Nevertheless, all of our new members have been eager to learn about Lionism and serve their communities. Most importantly, District 14-K leadership has been providing their guidance and support along the way.

We've been very busy since our initial meeting in March. Besides recruiting new members and conducting meetings, we have helped organize the food pantry and serve meals at the Allentown Men's Rescue Mission, collected over 600 pairs of used eyeglasses, delivered meals and local food pantry items, attended District Cabinet meetings, assembled and distributed personal care kits made from used eyeglass cases, collected and placed hundreds of used books throughout local Little Free Libraries and volunteered for the Boutique at the Rink fundraiser for cancer support.

GLVCLC just completed its first fundraiser by raising \$500 to sponsor Toffee, a Leader Dog puppy for the blind and awarding a total of \$750 to five lucky raffle ticket winners. Our fundraiser raffle for Leader Dog was a tremendous success thanks in part to the support and cooperation of many of the District 14-K clubs and members who bought tickets, while also providing opportunities for us to sell them. Upcoming service events will include our monthly visit to the Men's Rescue Mission, connecting with the community at Allentown's National Night Out event, supporting Dog Days of Summer at Kospia's Farm in Alburdis, attending a plant based nutrition workshop at Shoprite-Bethlehem, and volunteering to deliver food to community members in need. GLVCLC's leadership team includes Mike Perruso, President, Donna Bok, Secretary and Laurie Ryden, Treasurer. With the start of the new Lion year, we feel that our club has gained traction and is moving forward in a positive direction. We will continue to reach out and work with other district clubs. As a new club, we are still in our infancy but looking forward to becoming a beacon of service in our community.

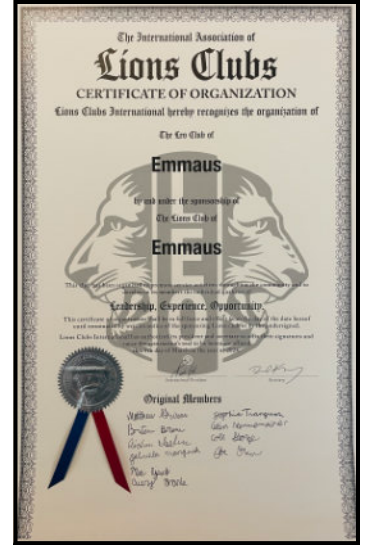
