Planning a Basket Raffle?



District 14-K has received questions and comments regarding the inclusion of alcoholic beverages in Basket Raffles.

Raffling a basket containing alcohol depends heavily on **local state and national liquor laws**, as Lions Clubs International (LCI) defers to local legal jurisdictions while enforcing strict liability policies.

Lions Clubs International & Local Policies

LCI Liability Stance: Lions Clubs International generally discourages clubs from participating in events involving the sale, distribution, or serving of alcohol due to high liability risks. If alcohol is part of an official club function, local Liquor Liability Insurance is strongly recommended or required.

"State/Local Legality on Alcohol Raffles: IN PENNSYLVANIA, WE ARE NOT LEGALLY ALLOWED TO RAFFLE ALCOHOL because it constitutes selling or distributing alcohol without a retail liquor license."

Consider an alternative...

The Gift Card Alternative: Where physical bottles of liquor or beer are banned from basket raffles, many legal counsels for Lions districts permit **substituting a wine, spirits, or brewery gift card** inside the basket instead of the actual beverage.
