

Childhood Cancer Subject of Talk at 2nd Cabinet Meeting

At the second Cabinet Meeting of District 14-K for Lions Year 2018-19, held at the Brass Rail restaurant in Allentown, on Saturday, Nov. 10, the guest speaker was Doug Sheriff from the Angel 34 Foundation, based in Township, Bushkill Northampton County.

Angel 34 provides service, support and hope for those battling childhood cancers. Sheriff told the Lions that 100,000 children around the world die each year from the disease. Their daughter, Nicole, was one of those stricken.

Even though she was ill, Nicole always helped out, Sheriff said, but she died at age 14. She would have been 29 now.

He said they work very closely to the hospitals, which have pediatric hos-pices. They offer programs for the family as their child goes through 2-1/2 to 3-1/2 years of treatments.

The Sheriffs are president and vice president of Angel 34, a name they picked for it as the number 34 coincidentally kept coming up. They plan on moving the program to different counties, feeling it is their job to educate the people about childhood cancer and to raise money to carry on their work.


