JARED BOX PROJECT FOR PEDIATRIC CANCER



What is it? How did it get started? How can I help?

I'm glad you asked! A Jared Box is a plastic shoesized storage box filled with small gifts, toys, games, crayons, coloring books, and fun activities. Each box contains items selected for a specific age group. The boxes are given to children in the hospital to provide a fun diversion. Jared McMullen diagnosed with incurable brainstem tumor in 1999. He carried a backpack full of toys and games to all appointments and questioned why the other children didn't bring toys to their exam rooms. Jared shared his toys and invited other children to join him in play. At

invited other children join him in play. At just 5 years old, he demonstrated faith, wisdom and compassion for others.
Sadly, Jared's bettle anded in

battle ended in November 2000.

J a r e d 's classmates sought to honor his memory and created boxes filled

with toys for hospitalized children. What was intended as a one-time project has grown to reach into the hearts of children and their families across 50 states.
