LION CARL SHOEMAKER FELLOWSHIP

In 1997, a blind man had a vision. His name was Carl Shoemaker, and he recognized a need for a recreational camp tailored for the blind of Pennsylvania. For that, he worked tirelessly with some of his fellow Lions to bring his vision to life. In1948, Vacation for the Blind was formed, and the property was purchased in Mount Union, PA. Since then, the camp's name has changed to PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp, and the camper population has expanded to include a wide variety of disabilities.

The Carl Shoemaker Fellowship was established in 2014 in memory of his outstanding Lion. \$500 donations to the Carl Shoemaker Fellowship will continueLion Carl's lifelong work to help the blind and special needs children and adults improve their lives through the camping experiences that Beacon Lodge has provided since 1948. The Carl Shoemaker Fellowship medal is often presented to a Lion or individual who shares the same spirit of volunteerism and the drive to serve, exemplified by Lion Carl Shoemaker.




