Then go out and 'Ask 1."

Our leaders are also important to the future of our district and our clubs. Did you know that the club secretary is a lifetime position? Well, it isn't, but many secretaries have served for a long time. Some continue to stay in the position because no one else wanted it. Perhaps your club could elect an assistant secretary to help with the work and learn how to do the job. Then you would have someone to step in and give your current secretary a break. Some secretaries don't want to let go. Perhaps if they had the chance to train someone else, they would be more willing to do so. Some clubs recycle presidents. In some of our smaller clubs, I can understand why this hap-pens. It should not happen as frequently as it does. Everyone in your club who wants to serve on the board or a committee should be given the chance to do so. That is how we learn to be leaders. Please encourage anyone who offers to step up.

The list of people willing to serve as District Governor is very short. I encourage everyone who is reading this to consider working toward this important and fulfilling position.
