




















District 14-K Governor's Message

February is considered the month of love and is the shortest month of the year. Hopefully 2021 is presenting you with many new opportunities and blessings, with fewer challenges!

How are you doing with any New Year's Resolutions? *Did your club set goals for 2021?* (Though my Thesaurus doesn't substitute the word 'resolution' for the word 'goal,' in my mind they are closely related.)



As 1VDG, one of my responsibilities (before 1/31/2021) is to set District goals for 2021-2022. Clubs and membership growth are at the top of **all** DGE lists as "We do not want Lionism to become extinct. We want Lionism to extend into the future." We are hearing wonderful stories of communities wanting to help others.

At a recent VDG Training, a prominent topic was "succession planning".

- · Does your club has a 5-year succession plan for officers?
- · Have you considered getting involved at district level?

MD 14 needs a <u>broader selection of qualified Lions to lead</u> us into the future. "Districts need to run at a peak performance level to best support healthy clubs. In order to maximize the efforts of district leadership, it may become necessary to restructure to operate in a more efficient and effective manner. The redistricting process is designed to accomplish that task."

Looking at the state districting map as of 1/11/2021, half the PA districts are under those membership/club requirements: B, E, N, J, L, H, W, U, & K.

District size requirements to grow the international family:

1,250 membership and 35 club minimum 14 K has only 767 members and 31 clubs

What is at stake? Inevitably a future DG team will be challenged to make controversial decisions on state-wide district mergers. If 14K's membership remains next-to-smallest in PA, potentially and sadly, we could be one the first districts "forced into merger".

ASK ONE! Despite a pandemic, 14K has opportunity for growth by focusing on persons "ten-years younger than ourselves" to join Lions, and perhaps to seek out specialty groups or ethnic groups in our area/neighborhoods. This past term, three MD14 three districts (A, G, M) added a total of six (6) new clubs this Lions' so far!

Lions year 2020-2021 still has six (6) months to make a difference.

- LCI will extend the waive of the \$35 fee for new members
- · LCI will hold back on the clubs (currently in upaid dues status) of "Status Quo"

Lions have valuable resources, grants, and leaders in PA! (Refer to flyers in this newsletter.)

- · In the world of <u>technology</u>, we have ZOOM;
- · In the world of money, we have financial support from LCI; and
- · In the world of <u>leaders</u>, we have an "International family" in PA.

To each and every Lion in 14K, let's not become extinct!

"WE CAN make a concerted effort to EXTEND into the Future!"

- Let's energize and gear-up to recruit in 2021!
- · Let's continue to deliver hope to our communities.
- · Let's continue to innovate and serve safely.
- Let's continue to keep our eyes and hearts open to new opportunities to make a difference everyday in people's lives.


Happy February to all. I hope you and your families remain safe and well. January has been a busy month with training. The 3 main objectives of the webinars that are taking place in the month of January focus on:



FAQ's: Frequently Asked Questions

Per capita dues

Lions Clubs International:

New Members pay a charter fee of \$35 or must submit the proper certification form waiver. International dues total \$43 annually and will be billed on a semi-annual basis. International dues for newly chartered clubs will be prorated for the months remaining in the semi-annual period ending either June 30 or December 31.

Family Members: The first family member (head of household) pays full international dues (\$43), and up to four additional family members pay only half the international dues (\$21.50). All family members pay the one-time charter fee of \$35. The Family Membership Program is open to family members who are (1) eligible for Lions membership, (2) currently in or joining the same club, and (3) living in the same household and related by birth, marriage or other legal relationship. Common household family members include parents, children, spouses, aunts and uncles, cousins, grandparents, in-laws and legal dependents.

Students between the age of majority and through age 30 pay no charter fee and half international dues. Students over age 30 and joining a Campus Lions club pay a \$10 charter fee and full international dues. New campus clubs, and clubs with a majority of students, must prepay one year international dues at the student member rate.

Graduating Leos: All graduating Leos receive a charter fee waiver. Graduating Leos, through the age of 35 who have been a Leo for at least a year and a day, pay half international dues.

Young adults, through the age of 30, receive a charter fee waiver and pay half international dues when joining a Leo Lions club.

Transfer members pay a US\$20 charter fee and must have left their former club in good standing and transfer to the new club within 12 months.

As of June 30, 2018, LCI will not issue international dues credits for membership drops after the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1.

State per capita dues are collected to provide revenue to defray the administrative expenses

of the Multiple District and each sub-District and a Multiple District Convention Fund, annual per capita dues of \$16.00 per member per year are collected. These dues are collected in two semi-annual payments based upon a club's membership total as shown by LCI as of July 1 and January 1 of each fiscal year.

As is the case with LCI for international dues, state per capita dues are not pro-rated for members added or dropped from club membership rolls after July 1 and before December 30 and/or after January 1 and before June 30.

State per capita dues collected are used, distributed and credited as follows (/member/year):

- State Convention Administrative Fund: \$0.45
- International Convention

Fund: \$0.85

- Promotional Fund: \$0.35
- District Governors

International Conv. Fund: \$0.35

• Sub-District Administrative

Fund: \$2.50

Public Relations/

Communications Fund: \$1.50

• All State Band: \$1.50

No liquor in basket raffles

REMINDER: A popular staple in basket raffles is a "no-no."

After researching the matter with the Executive Director of the PA House of Representatives' Liquor Committee and the PA Liquor Control



Board, MD-14 legal counsel Lion Ashley Grimm reported "liquor is not permitted to be in a basket for purposes of a raffle. This also includes silent auctions.

"This equates to selling liquor without a license," Lion Grimm said. "A wine and spirits gift card is permitted to be included in a raffle basket, though."

As part of a *New Castle News* story, Capt. Jamie Jones of the LCB Enforcement Bureau said including any type of alcoholic beverage – be it a six pack of beer, a bottle of wine, a bottle of whiskey or the like – is a violation of the Pennsylvania Liquor Code, Title 47, and is an unclassified misdemeanor offense. The fine upon conviction is \$500, levied to the organization sponsoring the fundraiser and not the donor of the basket.

In the *News* story, Lawrence County Treasurer Richard Rapone said, under the state's small games of chance law, it is illegal to host basket raffles at fundraising dinners used to benefit someone who is sick.

LCI dues increase delayed until July 1, 2022

International Director Larry Edwards reported during the second 2020-2021 MD-14 Council of Governors Zoom conference call that as of October 1, 2020, the 2019 LCI board resolution regarding dues increase would be be rescinded and that effective July 1, 2022 LCI bylaws will be amended to change semi-annual dues from \$21.50 to \$23.00 for a total of \$46.00 per year instead of \$43.00 per year (\$3.00 increase).

Effective July 1, 2023, LCI dues will increase to \$24.00 semi-annually or \$48.00 per year. Effective July 1, 2024, LCI dues will increase to \$25.00 semi-annually or \$50.00 per year. This is a \$7.00 increase over three years with no planned concurrent escalator after that.

LCI insurance cover COVID 19 illness claims?

The State Office is awaiting a response from LCI's Legal Division to a question concerning insurance coverage if someone claims they contracted COVID 19 as a result of attending or participating in a Lions Club project or fundraiser.

MD-14 general counsel Lion Ashley Grimm's preliminary opinion on the matter was, "typically, communicable diseases are not covered by insurance policies. This is because communicable diseases are a known problem that people should be aware of and people make a conscious decision to carry on their activities knowing the risks.

"Having said that," Lion Grimm continued, "if a person can trace back the fact that they were exposed to COVID-19 at a Lions event, liability may still attach, especially if all precautions were not taken. However, I need to review the policy before I can provide a definitive answer."

LCI Legal's tax reminder

"Please remember that all Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts that have annual gross receipts less than US\$50,000 and do not have to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well."

Help fight identity fraud

In advice from LCI's Legal Division, a general rule to follow is: Information such as individual Lions' names, mailing and email addresses and telephone numbers should not be posted on or made accessible on websites.

Check please! EIN numbers

Each club and district should have its own Employee Identification Number (EIN) and file a yearly report with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Clubs **should not** use the EIN assigned to the PA State Council of Lions Clubs and/or Lions Clubs International.

HOUSE OF DELEGATES APPOINTMENTS

The following three pages pertain to the House of Delegates for the selection of a preferred Multiple District 14 candidate for a position on the Lions Clubs International board of directors.

According to House of Delegates policy, prior to December 31 of each year, each MD-14 District Governor shall appoint a delegate for a three-year term to fill the vacancy of the delegate whose term is expiring that year. *PLEASE NOTE: That deadine has been extended this year to March 1, 2021 due to the extended absense of State Administrator Bob McComas*. The delegate whose term is expiring may be re-appointed for another three-year term. The appointee cannot be a member of the PA International Family. If no Lion has been appointed to fill the vacancy by the deadline, the three-year term shall be declared vacant and will remain vacant for three years.

All members of the House of Delegates must be in good standing in their Lions Club, and from Pennsylvania Lions Clubs in good standing.

Members of the 2020-2021 Council of Governors are asked to send the name, address and current email address of the delegate they are appointing for the term 1/1/2021 through 12/31/2023 to the State Office as soon as possible. No resumes are needed and the appointee does not need to be approved by the Council of Governors. The Lion does not need to be a Past District Governor. A member of the Council of Governors may appoint himself/herself at a member of the House of Delegates.

HOUSE OF DELEGATES PROCEDURE

- 1. Any Lion that is a seated member of the House of Delegates, who becomes ill or asks to be replaced for a justifiable reason, shall submit a letter of resignation to the District Governor and the State Office. The District Governor automatically replaces a member of the House of Delegates who passes away. The District Governor shall replace the delegate by December 31 prior to the meeting of the House of Delegates. The new delegate's name shall be forwarded to the State Office.
- 2. The Past International President and International Family will notify the State Office the year that the Multiple District is eligible to endorse an International Director or International Vice President Candidate.
- 3. When the State Office is notified by the International Family we are eligible to endorse a candidate for the office of International Director or International Vice President, the Council Chairperson shall request approval from the Council of Governors to convene the House of Delegates and the purpose of the meeting.
- 4. Each District Governor shall publish in the District newsletter that the Multiple District will be endorsing a candidate for International Director.
- 5. Any eligible Lion interested in seeking the office of International Director or International Vice President from an eligible district shall contact the State Office for the procedure of the House of Delegates.
- 6. Any Lion who meets the qualifications for International Director shall be endorsed by the Sub District in accordance with the International by-laws Article II Section 3, paragraphs a, b, c, d.
- 7. When the Lion receives his/her Club and Sub District endorsement at the Sub District Convention, the District Governor notifies the State Administrator, in writing (the month and year), that the Lion is endorsed.
 - 8. The Multiple District will only recognize the two-year endorsement of the candidate from the Sub District.
- 9. The State Council Chairperson shall be the Chairperson of the House of Delegates. The Multiple District Parliamentarian shall interpret the rules the House of Delegates of the meeting. The House of Delegates shall meet during a Pennsylvania Council of District Governors meeting or a Multiple District 14 Convention. Each District Governor shall be notified of the meeting 90 days prior to the meeting. The District Governor shall notify all Lions eligible to be candidates and those appointed to the House of Delegates, no less than 30 days prior to the meeting.
- 10. The meeting of the House of Delegates is an open meeting to all Lions. There shall be separate sections provided for the delegates, candidates and the audience.
- 11. After notification by the District Governor, eligible candidates for the office of International Director or International Vice President shall provide proper written Club and District endorsements to the State Office no less than 14 days prior to the meeting of the House of Delegates, at which time those candidates may announce their intentions.
- 12. At the meeting of the House of Delegates, the Chairperson shall appoint a secretary to take minutes of the meeting and conduct a roll call by District and by name. The minutes and the roll call of the meeting shall be kept on file at the State Office. The majority of the House of Delegates in attendance shall constitute a quorum. No delegate will be seated after the completion of roll call.

- 13. At the meeting of the House of Delegates, the Chairperson will announce each candidate in alphabetical order by District. Each candidate shall be called into the room individually. The candidate will be granted five (5) minutes to present his/her Lions Club and District endorsements and personal qualifications for the office of International Director or International Vice President. There may be two (2) seconding speeches of two (2) minutes each on behalf of each candidate. The candidate shall submit the names of the Lions making the seconding speeches to the Council Chair prior to meeting of the delegates. It is recommended that the Lions making the seconding not be delegates.
 - 14. Campaign signs, literature or demonstrations are not permitted in the meeting at the House of Delegates.
- 15. After the candidate has presented himself or herself, a question and answer period by the delegates will follow, not to exceed five (5) minutes.
- 16. Following the completion of all candidates' presentations, each candidate will be given the opportunity to withdraw, if he or she so chooses.
- 17. A secret written election ballot (provided by the State Office) will be held by the House of Delegates certified delegates and the winner determined by a majority of those casting votes. Where there are more than two (2) candidates receiving votes and no candidate has received a majority of the votes cast, the candidate receiving the least votes shall be excluded and another election vote shall be taken of the remaining candidates. This voting procedure shall be followed until one candidate receives a majority vote. The candidate receiving the second highest number of votes will be named as the alternate candidate. In the event there is a third candidate in the contest there shall be an election to determine the alternate candidate. The candidate receiving the majority of votes shall be declared the alternate candidate. When there is more than one candidate for the International Office, each candidate is entitled to have an observer present at the counting of the ballots. A delegate may be an observer at the vote counting.
 - 18. The House of Delegates meeting will not be adjourned until one candidate has received a majority of the votes cast.
- 19. In the event that only one qualified candidate is presented for an International office, that candidate automatically is the choice of the House of Delegates by a vote cast by the Secretary.
- 20. The successful candidate shall be presented for endorsement to the delegates at the next Multiple District 14 State Convention.
 - 21. The successful candidate is responsible for filing for certification as required by Lions Club International.
 - 22. All proceedings of the House of Delegates shall follow Robert's Rules of Order.
- 23. Guidelines for campaign material and hospitality rooms for endorsed sub-district candidates at the November and/or February State Council meetings are as follows:
 - 1. NO posters are permitted in public areas.
 - 2. Brochures may be distributed to all the Lions attending the meetings. <u>EXCEPTION</u>: No brochures may be distributed in the State Council meeting room or at the Friday and Saturday night banquet.

 Distribution of materials is permitted at the Friday night hospitality room. Each candidate is responsible for any campaign materials left lying around in public areas.
 - 3. Hospitality rooms may be conducted in the candidate's guest room (sleeping room) or the candidate may choose to arrange with the hotel for a room for use as a hospitality room. Candidates should contact the hotel about any restrictions in bringing snacks or drinks into their room.

SPECIAL CONVENTION PROCEDURE

A Special Convention of the clubs of the district may be called by a two-thirds vote of the District Cabinet at such time and place as they shall determine; provided that such Special Convention shall occur no less than 30 days prior to the convening date of the International Convention and that such Special Convention shall not be convened for the election of the district governor, first vice district governor or second vice district governor. Written notice of the Special Convention setting forth the time, place and purpose thereof, shall be provided to each club in the district by the District Cabinet, no less than 30 days prior to the convening date of the special convention.
