

Club went carolling at Lisa's House which is a personal care home in Danielsville. We had a great time and the residents even sang along. Each resident received a Christmas gift and ornament.





Wilson Borough Lions' "Adopt-a-Route" partners with Greater Lehigh Valley Meals on Wheels to Deliver Meals to Local Clients For the past two years the Wilson Boro Lions Club has partnered with The Greater Lehigh Valley Meals on Wheels to help deliver meals on the second Friday of each month. Each weekday Meals on Wheels prepares and oversees the delivery of nearly 1500 meals to clients throughout the Lehigh Valley, from Macungie to Easton and Center Valley to Bangor. All deliveries are done by volunteers.

The Wilson Lions Club provides two volunteers each month to deliver two prepared meals to 12 Wilson residents. They begin their delivery around 10:00 am by picking up a cooler, warming bag and client list at a local church pick up site. Included with the client list are driving directions and simple instructions on how to find the client's residence. The entire delivery process takes about 1 1/2 - 2 hours. Typically one volunteer does the driving while the other delivers the meals to the client. The clients are always happy to see our members and are so appreciative of the effort made to ensure they get a nutritious meal each day. Sometimes they are so happy to see us that they don't want us to leave. To date, ten members of the Wilson Boro Lions have delivered roughly 50 meals to 12 different clients over the past two years.
