In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards including the club Lion of the Year, Club President's Award, the Robert J. Uplinger Service Award, several District Governor Appreciation Awards, and the Multiple District Membership Growth Award. He is also the recipient of numerous International President's Certificates of Appreciation, seven International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is a Dr. Franklin G. Mason Fellow, a W. P. Woods Fellow and a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow. In addition to his Lions activities, President Alexander is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He has served as chairperson of the advisory board for the New York Urban League and as a board member of the St. Francis DeSales School for the Deaf. He is also a recipient of the Congressional Record Award. President Alexander has two daughters, and his partner in service, Shabiki Cazabon, is a Lion and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

I look forward to meeting more Lions and hearing about your successes and challenges after a year of masking, zoom meetings, and cabin fever.

TRAINING - Keep watch for upcoming summer schedule for Seminar training topics will include Zone Chairs, President, Secretaries, and Reporting Service.




To the Emmaus Lioness Lions Club,

2021 Virtual Camp at PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp

We are happy to announce that Beacon Lodge Camp will be offering Virtual Camp during the 2021 camping season!

We will not let the pandemic stop us from getting together and having fun with

Virtual camp will run from July 10 through July 14, for two hours each day, and will replace in-person Camp for the following sessions:

Adults - Transitional Care, Assisted Living, and Hearing Impaired.

Children- Camp ALIVE, Assisted Living, Blind/VI, and ENERGY

The daily schedule will be as follows:

7:45 AM to 9:45 AM - Adult Transitional Care and Assisted Living

10:00 AM to Noon - All Children's sessions

1:00 PM to 3:00 PM - Deaf/Hearing Impaired

For Virtual Camp attendees, the Camp fee will be waived for this year!

What will be required: \$100 Registration Fee, Online Registration Form, Recent photo of camper (so we can recognize their smiling faces), signed Photo/Video Release Form, and a valid email address.

Virtual Camp is online, so an internet-connected device and high-speed internet service (able to stream video) will be needed. Also, if the camper may require assistance, please make sure someone is available to help.

Upon receipt of the above-listed payment and documents, a confirmation email will be sent to the email address provided. Prior to virtual camp, an access link for the first day's session will be emailed to all attendees. Each day a new access link will be emailed for the following day's activities.

We will not require the Medical Form for Virtual Camp, but we do recommend that any camper who has a seizure disorder consult a doctor before enrolling.

What to Expect

Each day of virtual camp will begin with the National Anthem, flag raising, and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Each day will also have a theme - color of the day, word of the day, hat day, pet

Each day may include - Singing and dancing, Storytime, Exercise, Campfire Talks, good hygiene practices, round table discussions for thoughts and comments from campers, and more. There will also be cameo appearances from Itowe, the Camp mascot! We will have arts and crafts as well, but don't worry - you don't have to go shopping! Each registered camper will receive a package in the mail with all the needed supplies, mailed to the address on the registration form.

We are excited about Virtual Camp and are looking forward to reconnecting with all of our beloved campers - old friends, and new!



Graduate at the Forum!

The Des Moines Forum is only 10 weeks away! The Lions University Graduation details are as follows:

- When: Thursday, September 9 from 3:30-4:40 p.m. We will start promptly!
- Where: Iowa Events Center, Ballroom B
- Attire: Any attire for a Lions event is appropriate. Consider what you want to wear for a keepsake photo with the International President.
- Photos: In order to stay on schedule, volunteers from the Planning and Host Committees will take the photos and they will be uploaded to the website for you to save. You are welcome to take small group photos with fellow Lions at the conclusion of the ceremony.

Deadlines:

To graduate, requirements must be complete and credit applied for (within your Lions University account) no later than Saturday, July 31, 2021.

Materials for the Doctorate Project must be submitted by July 15, 2021, due to the additional time necessary to adequately review the material.

NO EXCEPTIONS to this deadline will be given! This information must be manually verified by a volunteer member of our Team prior to preparing graduation materials.

Applying for Credit:

To apply for credit, login to your Lions University account, and select "My Account" from the menu bar. Select the appropriate program from the sub-menu. Click the link that says "*Apply for xx Program Credit" to expand the options and check your current status. Click the links for the specific program requirements and answer the quiz questions. This MUST be completed by July 31 if you would like to be considered for the graduation list.

Forum Attendance Requirement:

Verifying past Forum attendance and explaining which are acceptable, is one of the areas that causes a delay in verifying that a member has met all the requirements of a Lions University program. As a reminder, the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forums eligible to claim for credit toward the Lions University programs are 2014 or later:

Reminder: Forum attendance is not required if you just wish to take the online courses available in our library.

Graduation List:



Committee appointments: 2021-2022 Council Meeting #1

In accordance with State Policy 401, "State Committee and Coordinators Appointments"

A Lion interested in serving on a State Committee or as a State Coordinator shall submit a written resume of qualifications for the said position and a signed Letter of Intent (Policy 401A) to their District Governor, who shall then forward that material to the State Office to be included in the pre-Council meeting packet distributed to members of the Council of Governors and PA International Family prior to the convening of the next State Council meeting.

Deadline for receipt by the State Office of Lions resume and Letter of Intent for the first 2021-2022 Council meeting is Monday, July 12.

A District that has a committee or coordinator appointment on the agenda of a Council Meeting and does not have a qualified Lion to serve may have the appointment tabled. The District Governor must return at the next Council Meeting with a qualified Lion or pass the appointment to the next District within the Region.

A Committee Chairperson, member of a committee or coordinator eligible for re-appointment must submit only a Letter of Intent stating his/her willingness to serve another term in order to be considered for reappointment.

Appointments by District Governors for Lions to act as State Convention Host Chairperson or State Council Meeting Host Chairperson should be appointed by the District Governor or the District Cabinet. A Lions resume and Letter of Intent is required.

All committee members are required to attend 50% of the committee meetings called by the Chairperson or Council of Governors



with the exception of the International Convention Committee members who are required to attend three of the four meetings.

State committee members and coordinators may serve on an Ad Hoc Committee appointed by the Council of Governors. The Ad Hoc Committee shall be in effect for one year from the date of appoint—ment. Members of the Ad Hoc Committee may be permi—tted to succeed themselves, if the Council of Governors extends the time for the existence of the committee. The Ad Hoc Committee shall be under the direction of the Council of Governors.

The following State Committee and Foundation board of director appointments are scheduled to be made by the 2021-2022 PA State Council of Lions Clubs' Council of Governors during its first meeting August 7 at the Red Lion Hotel Harrisburg Hershey.

Elder abuse (violence, psychological abuse, financial, sexual & neglect) has been on the rise during the Covid-19 pandemic. It's time to take the crisis seriously.

Key Facts.

- 1)Approximately 1 in 6 people 60 years & older experienced abuse in community settings this year
- 2)Rates of elder abuse are high in institutions such as long-term care facilities & nursing homes in the past year
- 3) Elder abuse is predicted to increase as the population ages.

Statistics

In recent years 16% of the elder population have been abused, but only about 4% has been reported.

What is Elder Abuse?

Elder Abuse is a term used to describe any knowing, intentional, or negligent act by a caregiver or any other person that causes harm or a serious risk of harm to a vulnerable adult. Elder abuse can come in various forms:

Physical/Sexual Abuse

Hitting, pushing, kicking, punching, pinching, biting, unnecessarily restraint, intentionally causing pain, intentional misuse of medication, sexual abuse/exploitation, etc.

Verbal Abuse

Calling names, put-downs, making fun, embarrassing/humiliating, criticism, etc.

Emotional Abuse

Threats of harm or abandonment, manipulation, mind games, gaslighting—making you feel crazy, isolation, noncommunication, intimidation, control, etc.

Financial Abuse

Pressure to make or making undue changes to legal, financial documents, theft of or withholding of funds, identity theft, etc.

Neglect & Self-Neglect

Deprivation of basic needs: food, water, housing, clothing, hygiene, medical care, emotional/social engagement, etc.

Self-Neglect involves an older adult, living independently, who is unable/unwilling to care for themselves leading to an environment threatening to health and safety.

Risk Factors for Elder Abuse

There are some factors that can put an older adult at increased risk for experiencing abuse including:

- An adult child who is still dependent on their older parent for financial assistance or housing—especially in cases where the adult child suffers from mental illness or a substance abuse disorder (addiction).
- A history of domestic violence in the home or family—as families grow and age, present problems of domestic violence often continue.
- Living with others in isolation— prevents likelihood of reporting of abuse.

PA Statistics on Elder Abuse

In national statistics, 1 in 10 adults 60+ have experienced some form of abuse. In Pennsylvania, since 2016, we have seen a 32% increase in number of reports of elder abuse—with a 38% increase in substantiated, or proven, claims of abuse.

- The age group most reported to be in need of protective services in PA were those between the ages of 81—90 and almost half of them lived in their own
- 46.8% of perpetrators of abuse were between the ages of 30—59 and 16.7% were identified as family members.
- The most common substantiated forms of abuse were: self-neglect, caregiver neglect, financial exploitation, physical, and emotional abuse.

Reporting Abuse

In the state of Pennsylvania, if you work with and suspect abuse of an individual over the age of 60—you are mandated to report it to the appropriate authorities.

 If you believe an adult is being abuse and their life is in imminent danger, call 911 immediately! Then report directly to protective services.

To make a report you may need to know:

- Age of the victim
- Address of the victim
- Victim's level of physical/mental capacity
- Date of the incident
- Whether or not there are weapons present in the home, if there is a history of drug/alcohol abuse or domestic violence in the home.
- How the alleged perpetrator might react to a worker coming to the home
- · What the best times to visit may be


