



Hello Lions, Lioness, and Leos,

I'd like to congratulate the winners and thank all who purchased tickets for the District 14-K Convention! The live drawing was held on Saturday, April 24 at the Moore Township Recreation Pavilion. Thanks, also, to all who attended the live drawing and supported our District. The complete winners' list is published here in the Tattle Tailer this month.



As reported on our District 14-K Facebook page, the district collected over 27,000 pair of used eyeglasses on April 24, as well as over 100 used hearing aids! I am amazed by the number of clubs who participated and delivered the eyeglasses and hearing aids. Thank you for helping those less fortunate! In case you were not aware of how the used glasses are given to those in need, PDG Tom Deiter shared that the glasses are all sent to third world countries, where they are placed on a table and people in need of glasses come and try them on until finding a pair that gives them the best vision possible. The hearing aids are repurposed by Dr. Kleckner and donated to those in need in our local area. Continue collecting those valuable items through the next year and let's surpass 27,000 next year.

My VDG training continues both online and in person in Atlanta, GA in May when I will attend the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute. I'm looking forward to meeting other participants and sharing District stories and learnings.


