Charity Navigator examines the financial health, accountability and transparency of charities to determine its ratings. Financial information is based on each charity's 990 tax filing in the USA. Ratings show how well evaluated charities have sustained their programs and services over time. **Why is this important to us?** LCIF's 4-star rating indicates that it consistently executes its mission in a fiscally responsible way. Only 5 percent of the charities evaluated earn a sixth consecutive 4-star rating, which means LCIF outperforms most charity organizations in the USA!

Vision Focused This Month

Lions are known throughout the world for their work to improve the lives of the visually impaired and prevent avoidable blindness. LCIF proudly serves their continued efforts by offering unique and impactful initiatives, programs and grants.

As I'm preparing my presentation on vision loss for this month. . . I realized how one little girl by the name of "Bonnie" had impacted my life and so many other lives back in the late 1950's in the little village of Slatedale, PA. You see I met Bonnie in Sunday School one Sunday morning. She was born blind. But she was so happy and friendly to be around. At my young age, I just could not understand how she could be so happy . . . she never experienced life in the same way that I and other kids had. But as I am sitting here reflecting on my time spent with Bonnie, I realized that we [family, friends, teachers, etc.] were her site back then. Her site was experienced through music and singing songs about "Climbing up Sunshine Mountain", Christmas songs and having her hold a figurine of Baby Jesus in the Manger as we sang. Thinking back, I remember her coming over to visit with me at my Mammy's house and after we would play with our Barbies, I would guide her walk over to the double seater swing in Mamie's garden. As we swung, oh how she smiled as the air hit your face and she could smell all the fragrances of the flowers in the garden. I would pick a flower; she would smell and feel it and I would describe the flower to her. You see that garden of friendship also had grape vines growing over the swing. One day we picked a bunch of grapes as we were swinging; and she got to taste those sweet little purple grapes that we would squeeze out of their skin. She wanted more and we picked more together using our blouses as holders. At the time I didn't realize how I was helping her to see through her other senses [speaking, smell, touch, hearing]; but now I realize how Bonnie was helping me to grow in kindness and understanding for those less fortunate in our world. **She taught me lessons on how to SERVE!** I wonder if Bonnie was born today how her life would be different with **The Historic Undertaking and the efforts of Lions in the field of vision** today. Lions SightFirst program has played a key role in reducing global blindness—building comprehensive and sustainable eye care systems, including projects that deliver eye care services, build or strengthen eye care facilities, train professionals and build awareness about eye health in underserved communities. ***I am only one person and limited to how many I can serve. . . but I do know that my donations to LCIF helps me to serve more individuals in need then I can ever imagine.***

Did You Know:

- >1 billion people live with vision impairment that could have been prevented or can be corrected.
- >US\$14.3 billion is needed to treat existing cases of refractive error and cataracts worldwide.
- >Unaddressed distance vision impairment in many low- and middle-income regions is 4 times higher than in high-income regions.
- >From July 2021 to January 2022, LCIF has awarded 61 vision-related grants totaling US\$7,198,705.

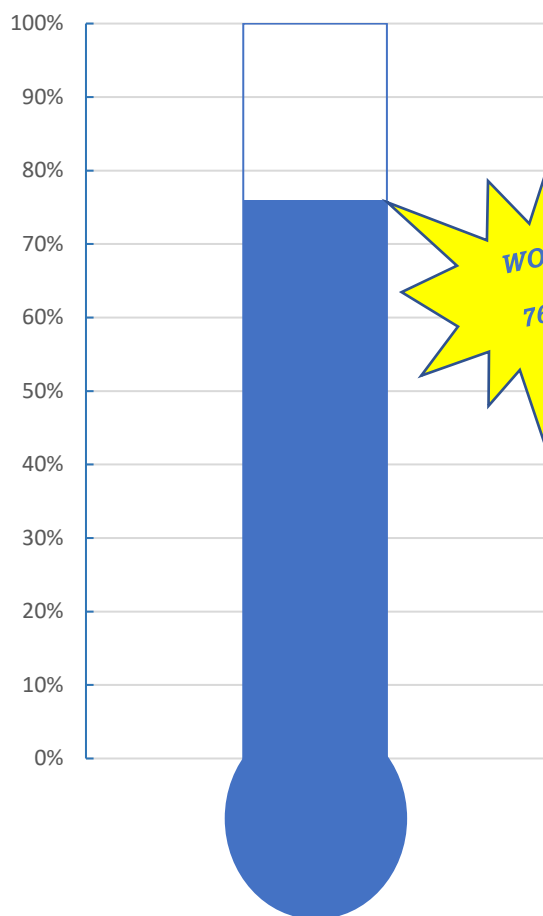

Slatington Lions Club Sponsors a Grant for Northern Lehigh Food Bank

The Slatington Lions Club, with the help of Past District Governor Karlene Laub, secured a grant from the **Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Service Foundation** to purchase three new upright freezers for the Northern Lehigh Food Bank. In addition to a walk-in freezer, the foodbank has 6 upright freezers, three of which are in poor shape. Two must be defrosted on a regular basis and one is 43 years old. On average, the food bank serves 220 adults, 100 children and 160 seniors each month. Last year they served 6427 people. The grant from NEPALSF was for \$2907.00 and the Slatington Lions Club made up the difference in price. The Northern Lehigh Foodbank is located at 7884 Center Street, Emerald, PA and serves the residents of the Northern Lehigh School District and/or the members of the churches associated with the Northern Lehigh Pastoral Association.

I still remember when my orientation and mobility instructor came in and told me about Leader Dogs for the Blind and their summer experience camp. I was sixteen and looking for guide dog schools.

[Soon] I was on a plane to Michigan for the best and busiest week of my life. As soon as I got there, I knew I was going to have an amazing time. I had the opportunity to experience so many things I never would have had the opportunity to had it not been for Leader Dog. They had tandem biking, ziplining, rockwall climbing, beep kickball, scavenger hunts, game nights, driving simulators, and so much more. The best part, though, was that I got to experience all these activities with other blind and visually impaired teens. If you ask any alumni from camp what their favorite part of the week was, there's a 9 out of 10 chance that they're going to say, "Dog Day." This is the day when we got to work with a guide dog and a guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI) to learn about what working with a guide dog is like.
