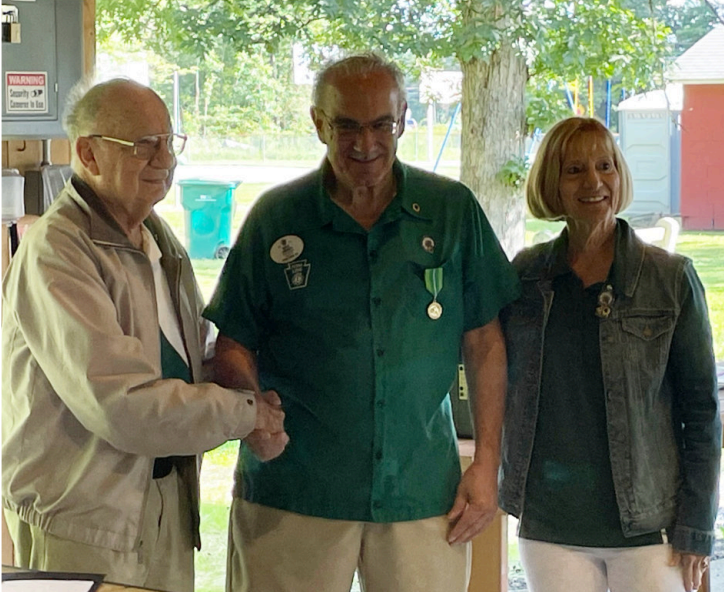

LEADER DOG RECEIVES DONATIONS FROM LIONS CLUBS OF DISTRICT 14K

Our district collectively donated \$8,507.25 to Leader Dog in the Lions year ending June 30, 2023. I thank you for your support of this wonderful organization.

I'm especially proud to report that the Pen Argyl High School Leo Club contributed over \$500.00 to Leader Dog.

Besides providing dogs to clients, Leader Dog has provided Orientation and Mobility training for over 20 years. They were the first U.S. guide dog organization to offer this training. They offer a week of in-depth training. Clients learn to navigate in a variety of environments, including indoor and outdoor settings, college campuses, rural areas, busy cities and other areas. They learn skills to help them travel safely and effectively. To date, Leader Dog has helped over 1,100 people gain O&M skills to help them increase their independence. Many O&M clients return to train with a Leader Dog. Others find that they function well with a cane after this training.

I am available to speak to your clubs or to speak at zone meetings. Please consider supporting Leader Dog as a Club or as an individual. The work they do is phenomenal.

If you are ever going to be in the area of Rochester Hills, MI, please contact them in advance to find out if you can visit. You will come away from there with a greater idea of how they fulfill their mission.

As he spoke I thought,.....Scott. ..you missed another great opportunity...he knows the history of this place and how everything works...you can tell that he truly loves what he does there...and I didn't record him so I could tell you the story. I'll tell what I can remember but please note that my memory isn't good.

The camp is supported by the PA Lions clubs...and each week throughout the summer individuals are hosted at the camp...all with a disability...from a pool, to hiking trails, a zip line, a fishing pond...a human powered train. ..camp fires and sleep outs...He tells stories of kids that are visually impaired that absolutely love the zip line...of the brail hiking trail...of the pool...and archery...and how the campers approach these activities.

As we toured the facility I was amazed at what they are able to accomplish there...all with donations from the Lions clubs of PA. I will go back and do a proper interview of him and get you the full story but as we rode around in the golf cart, I snapped photos...and tried to imagine a kid... who's entire life has been spent in a wheel chair must feel when they get hooked into a harness and then sent out on a zip line...the feeling of flying...what a joy that must be...or a blind person...my mind cant wrap itself around that...

Each building has a story...each trail...playground.. .outdoor bowling alley...stack of firewood...all have their own stories to tell...and in the middle of it all is a large Bicentennial Bell...made from donated brass keys...that were then melted down and poured to make the bell...

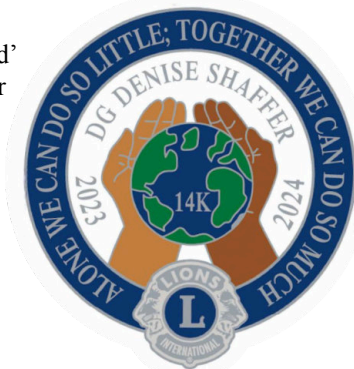

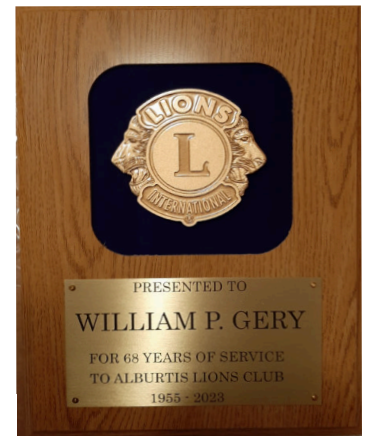
